We are sorry not to have written this in time for insertion in the last issue of the Newsletter and it seems hard to believe but it is now over three months since Peter died.

We (Pat, Prudence and Oscar) really appreciated the many letters and cards of condolence (over 200) sent by people living in Remenham, those in the church congregation and also Henley people. It was a great support to us that so many people sent their very personal reminiscences of Peter and his special character. One letter in particular referred back as far as 1977 when Peter was remembered turning up at the auction held in The Little Angel where the Cridlan's farmworkers' cottages were going under the hammer. And that is how we came to live in 103/104 Remenham Lane, the two cottages which are now known as "Old Blades".

We didn't move into Old Blades until May 1979 but spent the 1977 and 1978 Henley Royal Regattas in the garden. So this year is our family's 39th Henley Royal Regatta at Old Blades and we have again invited friends and family to join us. It will never, however, be quite the same without Peter sitting on the terrace holding forth with a glass in his hand!

FROM THE RECTORY

I wonder if anyone really imagines just how much administration is involved in running a parish - apart that is from those who are actually involved.

On my desk at the moment and waiting to be completed are, (apart from notes from Magazine editors that it's time to write this!) a list of things to do following a Parish Hall meeting, Agendas and voluminous papers for meetings two of Henley's Charities, notes from meetings from the Sea Cadets and John Hodges trust, a set of complicated instructions of what I must do to complete my Sea Cadets Safeguarding training on-line, and a whole pile of papers and forms relating to our Walsingham Pilgrimage in August. Jesus had little time for the 'jobsworth' church official who spent all his time criticising others' minor misdemeanours. And he had little time for those who 'heap burdens on other men's backs but do nothing to help them carry the burden'.

So next time you face a pile of papers or emails, just remember that it is highly unlikely that many of them will further the Kingdom of God, and are therefore full only of their own importance!

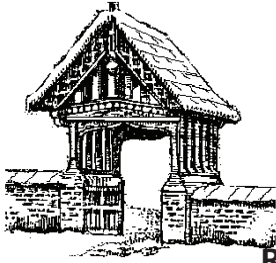

REMENHAM PARISH COUNCIL

As the Women's Royal Regatta is in full flow (along with Ascot and Queen's further afield), and Henley Royal Regatta (HRR) and the Henley Festival are approaching, summer has reached our pleasant part of the world.

Remenham Parish Council (RPC) met in the Parish Hall on 12 May and 9 June, and had its Annual Parish Meeting on 12 May, when we were pleased to see some of you. RPC agendas and minutes can be found on the website. *Some RPC minute numbers are given here in case they are useful.* To continue to ensure good governance, a new RPC Declarations of Interest form for councillors is being considered (77/15).

The Neighbourhood Plan (NP) (65/15) is being moved forward and RPC hopes that, through common ownership, cohesion within the Remenham community will be strengthened still further. This month has seen

- (i) comments received from Copas, Culden Faw and HRR (80/15)
- (ii) a questionnaire soon to be circulated (and promoted in the Fete) (80/15) and
- (iii) Sir Steve Redgrave and Charlotte Geeves invited to speak to a public meeting in Sept/Oct if a suitable/convenient date can be found – **this looks like September 8th so please put it in your diary.**

On planning, we have considered a number of planning applications; in each case where RPC was asked its views, it indicated that it had no concerns. It has, however, enquired about the number of plots with leisure cabin status on the Wargrave Road and is also to query the status of an animal petting farm.

It is very pleasing that our website (67/15), for which Sue Laing is the web controller, has been regularly viewed by around 2000 visitors/month. We plan to have more up-to-date website information on local road closures, a chairman's blog and the police are likely to be regular contributors.

There is little to report on licensing matters (68/15), although some events in our area do not need licenses (83/15). No location for a possible bottle bank (72/15) has been found.

On the positive side of traffic and highways, we hope to start tree planting to limit noise on Remenham Hill (76/15) and as you know there has been some resurfacing of Church Lane, Aston Lane and Remenham Lane in June (76/15). However, on the negative side taxis during HRR (69/15) and traffic flow on White Hill/Remenham Hill, Wargrave Road and Remenham

Lane (84/15), continue to be of concern throughout the year.

We would like to be more active on the traffic problems throughout the village, principally by putting pressure on Oxfordshire to change the phasing of the traffic lights on the bridge; do you want to be involved? If so please contact Paul Sermon or me.

Footpaths have been the subject of discussion, with the hope expressed that none would be lost (86/15). An e-mail complaining about the state of the towpath due to bird droppings has been received; it seems that Canada Geese, that are a part of the problem, are in general protected.

At the Annual Parish Meeting, I reported (76/15) that some services previously provided by Wokingham might in the future be lost, but thought our finances were in good shape, were this to happen.

The unaudited (73/15), internally audited (88/15) accounts and Audit Commission Accounting/Annual Governance statements for 2014-2015 of RPC have been accepted; they are soon to be submitted to external auditors and will then appear on the website. We are very grateful to Pat Sly for continuing to internally audit our accounts. As you know a bench has been installed on White Hill (77/15); we are considering insurance issues.

You may be interested to know that an RPC councillor attended the Save Townlands meeting this month (85/15) and that Wokingham has asked (87/15) for feedback on gypsy and travellers facilities (see the RPC noticeboard outside the Parish Hall).

Paul Sermon and I have a stock of blue bags for sale should you be in dire trouble.

As you know, RPC meets in the Parish Hall at 8pm on the 2nd Tuesday each month (except August unless there is business to consider) and so RPC's next meeting is on 14 July 2015; we hope to see some of you there. Either way, may July-August be warm and agreeable for us all.

Within the Borough, Bob Pitts, your other Borough Councillor has been elected deputy Mayor and continues on a huge number of committees including Corporate Parenting Board, Fostering Panel, Planning Committee, Secure Accommodation Panel, Special Council Executive (Deputy Chairman), Thames Valley Police and Crime Panel and Wokingham Learning Disability Partnership Board. In addition Bob sits on the Berkshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust and Royal Berkshire Hospital Foundation Trust Board of Governors. Phew.

I am delighted at having been appointed Deputy Executive Member for Highways and Planning for the Borough with the primary responsibility for Highways; consequently I have stood down as Chairman of the Conservative Group. I continue as a Trustee of the Piggott Trust, as Governor for Piggott Junior and Infant School and as a Parish Councillor in Wargrave.

After the usual business of the meeting there was a report on the successful Centenary Lunch at the Henley Cricket Club, where five Institutes of the group enjoyed the happy and festive occasion.

The President, Judy Palmer went on to explain this year's Resolution for the National A.G.M. which in essence is to "to remove the distinction between social care and home care" (this was subsequently reworded).

The speaker was Dr Jim McWhirter whose talk was on the Kamuli Mission; in the rural areas of Uganda. The mission hospitals suffer constant shortages of essential supplies. The Rotary Doctor Bank of G.B supplies voluntary doctors, nurses and midwives to work in the hospitals, to teach and support the very overstretched staff. Dr McWhirter, himself a volunteer, spoke movingly of the heroic work done, and showed a short film. He was warmly thanked by Judy Palmer.

The usual delicious tea was enjoyed ending a thought provoking meeting.

JUNE

The June meeting was a stylish event! The President and Treasurer were attired in their elegant outfits for the Buckingham Palace Tea Party - which they had both attended . The President, Judy Palmer had also been to the National A.G.M. at the Albert Hall where three Royals including H.M. the Queen were present.
