Not much room for editorial this time! There is a lot to include in the Newsletter as the next two months are action-packed in the parish, especially in the first week of September.

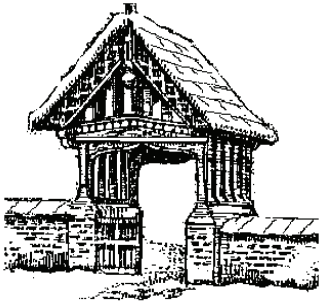

Autumn

It seems just a moment ago that summer started. I hope that it was good for you. Please let me know of any concerns that you may have had with any of the events. There are a series of meetings at which your concerns can be addressed.

Meeting on September 8th

Unusually we are holding a Parish Meeting on September 8th at 8.00pm. We will hold the parish council meeting before at 6.30pm; you are welcome to attend. The purpose of the Parish Meeting is to introduce Charlotte Geeves, the new Chief Executive of the Henley Festival, Sir Steve Redgrave the new Chairman of Henley Royal Regatta Committee of Management, the questionnaire for the Parish Plan, the Parish Council's Highways initiative and AOB. We will be supplying refreshments.

Please come as it should be enjoyable and informative.

Roads

The lanes were finally repaired but the surface dressing is still to be done.

Highways Initiative

Currently, I am the deputy executive member of WBC for Highways and Planning with the principle responsibility for Highways. As such it an ideal opportunity to address our highways issue, particularly as David Nimmo-Smith is the county councillor and district councillor for Henley as well as being the leader of the Conservative Group in Henley Town.

The initiative is multi-faceted and seeks to review the traffic orders for events, lower the speed on the lanes, address the traffic flow before and after events and to try to address the lights on the bridge. We have set up a meeting between WBC and OCC for September. We need as much help as we can get to persuade those queuing on Remenham Hill that it is OCC who is to blame. To help would be to participate in the campaign writing to various newspapers, blogs, MPs, County Councillors as well as leafleting those waiting. If you are prepared to help please let me know – we need everybody in the village ideally!

Road Planting on Remenham Hill

Disappointingly (to me) WBC surveyed the pavement and verge on the house side of the Hill and suggested that it may be difficult to plant that side due to buried services. However, they will review this with detailed mapping and will let us know what if anything we can do. However, it was suggested we may consider approaching homeowners and planting, with their permission, within their gardens to achieve the same end.

It was however pointed out if the ambition is to slow traffic some judicious planting on the Park Place side of the road would create an aspect which may help.

Henley Royal Regatta

Whilst I have yet to see the statistics, I understand crime figures were low.

On 28 July about 30 members and friends went by coach to Royal Holloway College in Egham. This extraordinary chateau-style building was the vision of Thomas Holloway, a Victorian tycoon whose fortune was made from ointment and pills that he claimed would cure almost anything (needless to say a spurious claim!). Nevertheless, through extensive advertising and promotion he made a vast fortune. Influenced by Matthew Vassar who built the first college for women in the United States, Holloway decided to fund a similar college in this country. Thus Royal Holloway College was built, and opened by Queen Victoria in 1886. Starting with 28 students it now has over 8000! The guide, Richard Williams was splendid, telling the amazing story of the self-made entrepreneur, his spectacular ambition and vision. Remenham's secretary Enid Light added fascinating additional information as she is an Honorary Fellow of the College. A delicious lunch was served in the magnificent picture gallery – sitting with so many Victorian masterpieces was a memorable experience!

Thanks to Anne Francis and Enid Light for arranging such a very special day.

The second Summer treat was a delightful tea party at Marsh Mills House, hosted by George and Sheila Constantinidi, beginning with boat trips on the river followed by a grand tea with sandwiches, scones and tempting cakes set out in the dining room. TRIBUTE TO PETER SLY (3rd November 1929--9th March 2015)

To the parishioners of Remenham, there seemed to be at least three Peter Slys.

First, the blustering, joshing character dealing out baffling quips or delivering carefully crafted sagas at village gatherings.

The second Peter was reputed to speak Latin (probably with a Welsh accent), do The Times Cryptic crossword in a flash and to be a pernicky grammarian. He must have been a useful occasional 'second opinion' for his wife Pat who cajoled contributors and distributors and then organised and produced The Remenham Newsletter effectively single handed for 25 years.

The third Peter, together with Pat, were a dynamic pair who motivated Remenham by making things happen such as village functions, and in the 1990's, maintaining the church and parish hall. Most striking of all, they helped people; they took Fred of the Flower Pot into their house and cared for him as he neared his end. Similarly they eased the last months of Teddy Selwyn's life when he fell on hard times.

Peter once told me three facts about his early life. As a young boy he saw the Crystal Palace as it burned down in 1936 and about 12 years later, in spite of WW2 disruption of his schooling in London, Sussex and Wales, he was awarded an exhibition to St Catharine's College, Cambridge. Surprisingly, instead of taking up the award after his stint as a conscript, he opted to stay and serve in the army where his career blossomed. He didn't say what his role was as a senior officer. It was a time when many National Servicemen of Peter's vintage were called on to defend the UK and Europe as the Cold War unfolded or to deal with the consequences of the 'wind of change' overseas.

The village has lost a memorable character. Our thoughts go out to Pat and their family whose loss must be so much greater.

ABSOLUTE BEGINNERS YOGA AT THE CRICKET CLUB

Tina Jacobs who lives in Remenham is one of the most experienced yoga teachers in the Henley area - she's been teaching for nine years and practicing for fifteen. She is starting a brand new 'Absolute Beginners' class on 24th September at Henley Cricket Club Pavilion from 9.30 – 11.00 am.

Yoga has so many benefits; lower blood pressure, increased strength and bone density and reduced anxiety. That should be enough to get most people on the mat! But there are some interesting myths around yoga that can stop people giving it a try; it's slow and boring, it's only effective if practised at speed in 90C heat, it's just for girls and, most common of all – yoga is for people who are flexible. The truth is that there will be a class to suit you whatever your body type or temperament. Yoga develops strength, balance and concentration as well as flexibility. Being flexible happens because you practice yoga – it's not a prerequisite! All yoga styles create a feeling of lightness, ease and relaxation but to get the most benefit, and the most enjoyment, you need to find a class that suits you.

Tina qualified with The British Wheel of Yoga after a four year diploma course and continues to study anatomy, structural integration and mindfulness – bringing these into her teaching. Tina teaches Hatha yoga and is influenced by the work of Italian teacher Vanda Scaravelli who encouraged work with breath and gravity to release the spine and so the whole body.
