FROM THE RECTORY

Dear friends

Although we tend to get rather caught up in events at this time of year in and around Remenham, it seems to me that our village is really quite resilient to it all - as indeed it always has been. Perhaps it's something in the water (!) but the history of Remenham is sprinkled with times when really it should have 'gone under'.

St Nicholas' church was once looked after by the monks from nearby Hurley - as a tiny place, it might well have been where monks who needed to be moved from the main abbey for any number of reasons were sent. A similar situation existed in Henley rather more recently, because the Coach House, next door to the old Rectory, served a similar purpose for wayward clergy who needed to be removed quickly from their parishes. Thankfully I no longer have custody of these 'troublesome priests' though I can't help feeling life might have been less measured than it is now if I did!

So our village survived the naughty ministers, as it survived the onslaught of the Reformation, and even the Plague. The latter almost wiped the village off the map, and only a few faithful souls ensured that their church continued to function until more people moved into the village, no longer gathered around the church but spread right across the parish, thinly spread admittedly, but continuing Remenham's story nevertheless.

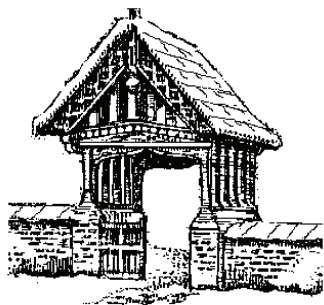

REMENHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Parish Meeting

I would like to apologise for a somewhat chaotic annual parish council and annual parish meeting. Normally they are held on the same day and there is no problem. However, this year there was a planning application (Malmesbury House – see below) which attracted a great deal of public interest and that was combined with an administrative confusion as to who was producing minutes and agendas, combined with a need to go paperless as WBC is turning off the paper documents to Parish Councils. Next year I think we'll play it safe and have the two meetings on different days!

Election of Officers

The Parish Council elected me (John Halsall) as Chairman and Richard Fletcher as Deputy Chairman.

Frances (Franky) Cookson

I am delighted to welcome Franky to the Parish Council. Franky lives in Middle Culham. She has a substantial management experience and a strong marketing background. She is currently working as a Marketing and PR Consultant, with a focus on green issues, which should be very useful for the Parish.



Malmesbury House Polo Pitch

An application has been made to convert what would have been a private house (estate) within Park Place to a Polo Pitch and ancillary facilities for the owner of Park Place House. Extensive discussions were held with the agent to modify the proposals to make them more acceptable to residents. These modifications were in the main agreed to and have been put to the planning authority, Wokingham Borough Council.

During a public meeting, it was proposed that the Parish Council oppose the development in its entirety. The planning authority had previously indicated that they considered the proposal within the scope of what it considered a suitable use for the land, therefore planning grounds for opposition were not there.

Bird Place Cottage

There has been substantial development at Bird Place Cottage, for which no planning permission has been granted. Bird Place Cottage is in the Green Belt and is in a Conservation area. Whilst retrospective planning permission has been applied for, the Parish Council felt that what has been done has a detrimental impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

Traffic

The events season has started again with the usual frustrations by local residents with traffic. Last year we had much discussion as to what could and should be done. There was a survey. These split the problem into three: The Third bridge, Henley Bridge and Whitehill, and the rat run. It was concluded that there may be momentum for a third bridge but it was unlikely to happen soon and if it did it would not impact Remenham much. Whilst there are easy solutions to the rat run, all would in some way inconveniencing Remenham residents and as such there was no consensus. Together with Henley Town Council and Harpsden, Darrel and I have been working proposals to alleviate the traffic situation and pollution within Henley and thus alleviate the problem for Remenham.

Traffic Meeting

In order to properly capture your current concerns, please attend the Parish Council meeting on 12th July after the Festival.

Neighbourhood Plan Survey

Thank you for the replies to the survey. Preliminary results suggest that the village's main preoccupation is traffic.

Superfast Broadband

I am looking at alternative suppliers to see if we can provide Superfast Broadband to Remenham. Please contact me if you have ideas or would be interested in obtaining superfast broadband.

Atmospheric Pollution

The Parish council is increasingly concerned about the possibility of the traffic jams causing unacceptable levels of atmospheric pollution within the parish and proposes to measure this during 2016/17.

Wokingham Borough Elections

Thank you for your support at the election and I shall proudly support you at Wokingham during the next four years. The result of the elections for Wokingham Borough Council was forty-eight Conservatives, one Labour and five Lib-Dems.

Wokingham Borough Internal Elections

Every year, each of the parties has a "Group" meeting and an internal election. In the Conservative party, there are only five elected positions, the party's nomination for Mayor,

Deputy Mayor, the Chairman, deputy Chairman and Leader. The Mayor and deputy Mayor are Borough ceremonial positions. The Chairman and deputy Chairman chair Conservative group meetings.

Borough Councillors

I believe firmly that almost everything that Blair (and Heath) enacted has been a disaster. Blair's revision of the local government system from committees to an executive has meant that power is concentrated in very few hands and by paying Councillors, the leader has huge powers of patronage.

The basic allowance of £7,552 is supposed to cover home office and all constituency business and expenses. In addition to which there are special responsibility allowances and fees which can build the amount receivable up to as much as £27,552. If a member is on a pension, these amounts can be material and will buy loyalty.

Leader of the Council

The leader in the executive system has dictatorial powers. All appointments are made by the leader, who controls the council. If there is a benevolent leader, whose prime consideration is towards the residents it works well; otherwise, it is a very flawed system. We have had three Conservative leaders since the Borough was formed only one of which has come close to what I would consider as adequate. (The Lib Dem nearly bankrupted the Council).

The Whip and Group Rules

The Group rules say that members have to vote with the party effectively agreeing with the leader on all matters. This reduces debate to a minimum. Milton Friedman coined the phrase "the tyranny of the status quo", which does not just refer to the fact that human beings are change averse, though we are. It refers, also, to the way in which a corpus of vested interests grows up around whatever happens to be the established settlement. There are, of course, a few individuals who put principle first – class traitors to the majority, who respond to incentives. Bob and I may well find ourselves in the small principled group.

Bob Pitts and John Halsall

I am incredibly proud that Bob was unanimously elected as Wokingham Borough Mayor. His focus is to raise the profile of the Northern Parishes and is available through the Mayor's office. I have decided to concentrate on the Ward but am on the Borough Parish Liaison Forum, the Secure Accommodation Panel and the Piggott Trust.

CELEBRATION OF THE QUEEN'S 90th BIRTHDAY

Despite the nerves of the organisers about the weather, we were incredibly lucky as it was mostly fine with only a few spitty spots of rain; it wouldn't have been a proper English occasion without umbrellas going up at least twice and it was pleasantly warm.

The Rector proposed a toast to the Queen at the beginning of proceedings and we all raised a glass of fizz, kindly provided by Practicus (a business in Remenham Barns) and Mrs Schwarzenbach from Culham Court, to Her Majesty.

Many thanks to all who took part; to the Copas Partnership for providing the tables and chairs; to David and Joe Dawes who moved the furniture; and to everyone who went up (and down) ladders to fix lights, flags etc.
