FROM THE RECTORY

Dear Remenham friends,

The end of June has for very many years been a time for ordinations in the Church of England. The reason for this is that the Feast of St Peter (or Ss Peter and Paul in the new calendar) falls on 29th June. The tradition of Petertide ordinations connects those being ordained to ministry in the Church today with St Peter and the first disciples, amongst whom St Peter was a leader, although a flawed one.

Jesus' approach to what we today call "leadership" is striking even today. His radical emphasis on leadership as service rather than power and domination has important things to say to anyone in any position of authority in every generation.

One of the most moving stories in the gospels comes at the end of John's gospel. Peter, you will no doubt remember, denied knowing Jesus three times after Jesus' arrest. After the Resurrection, Jesus appears to Peter and some of the others by the Sea of Galilee. He takes Peter aside and says to him:

Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me more than these? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my lambs.

He saith to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my sheep.

He saith unto him the third time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? Peter was grieved because he said unto him the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, Feed my sheep.

Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldst: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry thee whither thou wouldst not.

This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.

Peter may have a pre-eminence among the first disciples, but his leadership, if we want to use that term, is understood by Jesus in terms of the care that he is to take of others, expressed in the repeated command to "feed my sheep". Jesus also makes clear to Peter that his path is to be one of sacrifice: he is to live for Jesus and for others rather than for himself, and he will be called on to pay the ultimate price for his faith. And at the end, Jesus calls Peter to follow him, reminding him that, notwithstanding his pre-eminent role, he remains, above all, a disciple.

This Sunday for the first time in many years our Benefice is sending a candidate, our curate the Revd Romey Poston, to Dorchester Abbey to be ordained to the priesthood. If you are the praying sort, please pray for her, that she may be strengthened and blessed in her new ministry, and for the parishes of Henley and Remenham in which she serves.

CHARLOTTE EVERY MBE

The following is the announcement of Charlotte's MBE in the Henley Standard of June 2022.



"A WOMAN from Remenham has been made an MBE in the Queen's Jubilee Birthday Honours for services to Parliament.

Charlotte Every, 61, works as assistant to the clerk assistant in the House of Commons.

She said: "I was absolutely thrilled and quite surprised by the news but very honoured."

Her role is to support the clerk assistant, who leads a team of 500 staff providing advice and support for all the proceedings in the Commons and its committees.

Miss Every, who was born in Henley and has lived in Remenham since she was five, said: "We provide procedural advice to the speaker and oversee the progress of legislation and everything that goes on on the floor of the House and in Westminster Hall, a second procedural chamber. Among other things, I help make sure everyone has the briefing for the day. It's a fascinating and exciting role that lets you really see the workings of Parliament from the ground and has been especially so for the last few years with Brexit and covid. Brexit was a very, very busy time for us with all of the procedural matters. Then, just as we thought things were settling down, along came covid. We had to completely adapt how the House works from electronic voting to hybrid sittings, making changes almost overnight that would usually have taken months."

Miss Every started working in the House of Commons in 1996 as personal assistant to the sergeant of arms, an official responsible for order. She was then the speaker's diary secretary until 2009 when she took on her current role.

She is very active in her community. Miss Every is a former member of Remenham Parish Council and helped to set up and run the village website. She has been a churchwarden at the Church of St Nicholas in the village since 2009. She has also helped to organise the village's platinum jubilee celebrations this weekend. These include a free concert in the church at 5pm on Saturday, a free tea party in the church hall garden on Sunday at 3pm and a flower festival in the church all weekend.

"We have been very busy," said Miss Every. "We started thinking about what we would do before Christmas and have been actively planning from February."

To relax she likes to get out into the countryside. Miss Every said: "I love walking and during the pandemic I really discovered how lovely our countryside is. I got to know the Hambleton Valley really well, sometimes walking up to 25 miles in a day."

The extended Platinum Jubilee weekend culminated in a very successful Parish celebration party in the garden of the Parish hall. Congratulations go to the hard working Parish Hall committee and their many helpers for planning and implementing such a successful occasion. Delicious home made sandwiches and cakes were eagerly consumed and washed down with copious quantities of tea, beer and wine! The Parish



council donated a commemorative mug to every child and grandchild attending.



As I write the Parish is bracing itself for another season of hopefully very successful and well managed events over the coming weeks. We have had the buzz of the Women's Regatta bringing competitors and supporters to our beautiful Parish. Henley Royal Regatta begins on Tuesday 28th June and brings an impressive collection of world class rowers from around the world plus many thousand quite thirsty spectators!

The weekend of 19th – 21st August brings the return of Rewind Festival and its many attendees.

As Parishioners we all chose to have homes in this beautiful green oasis in England and as a Parish Council we need to strive to find the delicate balance of protecting the interests of the residents whilst allowing visitors to share the beauty of our Parish. To this end a working Party of Ron Emerson and Neil Brown have drafted a report on behalf of Remenham residents which supports a review of licensed events in the Parish. King's Chambers have been asked to provide a substantive response. This has taken longer than we would have expected and Chambers have apologised for the delay as a result of personnel issues. We hope to have their opinion in time for the 11th July RPC meeting.



GigaClear have just indicated that the next stage of their fibre installation (with road closures) is as follows:

Remenham Lane	1-12th Sept
Ferry Lane	5-23rd Sept
Aston Lane	7-27th Sept

RPC have invited Gigaclear to attend the July meeting to discuss the full extent of its supply provisions to properties in the Parish, making good of trenchwork, and any other questions from residents.

Community Infrastructure Levy monies received from WBC should be spent wisely in the remainder of 2022. Polly Hogan is taking forward the replacement of the one RPC-towpath bench. John Merkel is progressing a report on a biodiversity survey and wild trail installation alongside the A321. Darrel Poulos is taking forward a defibrillator on the towpath near Temple Island. Paul Sermon is finalizing the installation of traffic speed/traffic congestion/air pollution monitors on White Hill and the block paving in front of the Parish Hall. All hope to report significant progress at the July meeting and will welcome feedback from residents.

Please enjoy the summer (assuming we have one) and think about coming along to participate in the Parish Council meetings in future.

REMENHAM CELEBRATES THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

As with previous Jubilees, Remenham celebrated the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen with great enthusiasm.

The events kicked off for some of us with the delivery by the Copas Partnership of the tables and chairs to the Parish Hall on a glorious sunny Tuesday – spirits were high and the speed with which the tables were set down by the forklift truck was amazing. On Saturday morning we gathered again in the Hall garden with a working party to set up the tables and put out the flags – it poured with rain, and we were a little bit more gloomy about the weather prospects for the party but there was still a lot of laughs and the garden and hall soon looked very jolly with bunting everywhere.



Meanwhile, it was a hive of activity as the preparations for the flower festival in church got under way. Wonderfully organised by Penny Whitfield and Mandy Cook who bought the flowers and allocated them to the flower arrangers. Using a mixture of purple, white and yellow flowers



arranged by church flower arranging team, the church looked glorious.



On Saturday evening the sun came out – hurrah! And we all enjoyed a fabulous concert put on in church by Felicity Rutland who had organised a group of local musicians and performers who played a variety of pieces alternating with some community singing of the Queen's favourite songs including *I'm Leaning on a Lamppost*, *The White Cliffs of Dover* and *Praise my Soul the King of Heaven*. Performers included Adam Isaac (singing and guitar), John Nelson and Brian Ward on the ukulele, Hugh Whitfield and Eleanor Biles on the bassoon and cello, Jeremy Tayler (singing and guitar), Madeline Duffy (flute), Suzanne Shaw (keyboard) and Kat Green who sang another of her Majesty's favourites *The Lord's my Shepherd*.

Eleanor Biles is a very talented young cellist from Queen Anne's in Caversham who at only 13 has passed her Grade 8 and was a finalist in the Berkshire young Musician of the Year: she is well worth keeping an eye on. It was also quite surprising (in a good way) to see the Rector in his double denim and bare feet giving us his Bob Dylan! The concert was a great success with an audience of 75 and was followed by refreshments in the churchyard in the evening sunshine. *(See page ** for write-up on the concert by The Henley Standard.)*

With the weather forecast getting worse by the minute, we began our preparations for the Jubilee tea party on Sunday morning. Piles of cakes and sandwiches began to arrive at the Hall, the tables were laid with red, white and blue, the bar was set up, the food prepared, and we looked anxiously at the grey sky. At 3.00pm people began arriving, the Rector opened the event with a few words and three cheers for HM the Queen and the party got under way.



In addition to the delicious tea there was a raffle and each child in the Parish under 16 was given a bespoke Jubilee mug, financed by the Parish Council.

In the end it never rained, and a good time was had by all and it was so lovely to see so many people of all ages from throughout the parish coming together at last after the horrors of Covid.

"A JUBILEE concert was held in the Church of St Nicholas in Remenham on Saturday. About 80 people attended the evening event, which featured bassoon playing and songs on the ukulele.



Adam Isaac played a cover of Budapest by George Ezra and his own song Elevation on acoustic guitar.

Ukelele players John Nelson and Brian Ward then led the audience in a collective singing of *Leaning on a Lamp Post* by George Formby.



A range of classical music was performed by Hugh Whitfield on bassoon and 14-year-old Eleanor Biles on cello. Eleanor, from Caversham, was a finalist in the Berkshire Young Musician of the Year competition in 2019.

She said: "I think this is one of the largest crowds I have played in front of. They were very supportive and I was really happy with my performance."





Jeremy Tayler, the rector, played folk and country classics on guitar, including *Mr Tambourine Man* by Bob Dylan and *Lonesome, On'ry and Mean* by Waylon Jennings.

Madeline Duffy performed *White Cliffs of Dover* on the flute, and Kat Green sang the hymn *The Lord is My Shepherd*.



Suzannah Shaw played *Salut d'Amour* on a keyboard before accompanying the audience in performing some of the Queen's favourite pieces of music, including *Cheek to Cheek* by Fred Astaire and the hymn *Praise My Soul the King of Heaven*.

This was followed by a rendition of the National Anthem. After the concert there was a short drinks reception in the churchyard.



Felicity Rutland, who led and organised the evening, said: "I have organised lots of events before but I have never been as nervous as I was for this. I thought at one point we would only get about 20 people, so I was amazed by the size of the audience. Music is one of my proud passions, so it is wonderful to bring the community together for a collective celebration of all the local talent."
