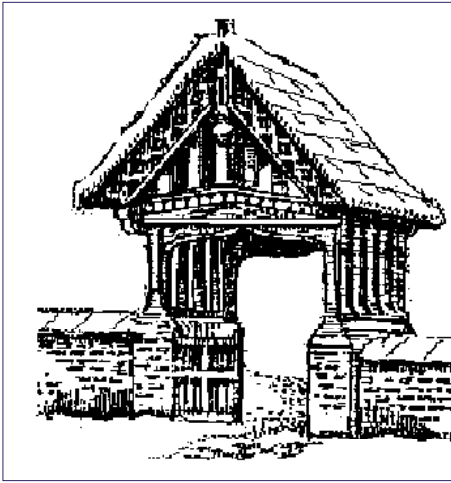

NOTES FROM REMENHAM PARISH COUNCIL



August

My nearly green lawn is telling me our summer this year has been closer to normal than the last two which parched the land. At the risk of an outcry therefore, I differ from those who bemoan the weather of the last few months. We live in Remenham, in Britain, famed for its unpredictable but generally pleasant climate!

With August comes Rewind Festival and around 40,000 visitors over a weekend. Most if not all appear to have a wonderful time enjoying the one hit wonders of the '80's and 90's. Remenham again becomes a magnet

for revellers. This time with slightly more garish outfits than we see at Regatta and Festival (*see opposite*). The local residents of Remenham village are clearly most impacted by the arrival of the festival goers and hopefully the pre work of Ron Emerson and Neil Brown within the Remenham Farm Association will have reduced the impact of the build up and removal of facilities. The Parish Council has supported this group and we will have a full debrief meeting on September 11th in the Parish Hall to evaluate this year's outcome.

August is a quieter time generally for RPC as there is no meeting, to accommodate councillors' holiday plans. We are all back on duty in September and will collectively be recharged for another year of supporting the interests of parishioners.

We are still recruiting for a part time path and street litter picker so if anyone knows of somebody who enjoys a walk and who would welcome some pocket money please shout.

Despite the lure of holidays, councillor Polly Hogan arranged a working party of Aston residents who marched up to the mid section of Aston Lane with their shovels and brooms and enjoyed two hours of hard labour one late July Saturday morning. The results were a stone and mud free section making life safer for the many cyclists using the lane. Two days later Wokingham arranged a drain clearing machine to reinstate the single, mud choked drain in the mid section. Thanks to all involved.

Planning matters continue to be reviewed during the summer months.

Two final mentions before I sign off:

At last it appears that Gigaclear are now connecting properties to the superfast fibre broadband supply. My own is planned for early September so I will report back on progress in the Autumn newsletter.

As I hope everyone has already noted the well-publicised Remenham Fayre takes place at the Village Hall on Sunday 3rd September. Please try to come down early afternoon to join in the fun and chat with fellow parishioners. Janette Brown is leading a busy and capable team to ensure the day is a great success. This is truly the pinnacle of the Summer Season showing Wimbledon, Ascot and HRR how it should be done!

TALES FROM OLD HENLEY - Henley Standard, Sept 19th, 1941.

REMENHAM PARISH CHURCH - MUSICAL SERVICE

Remenham Parish Church was well filled on Sunday afternoon last for a special musical service arranged by the organist, Corporal F C Rogers, RAF., who was home on leave and at short notice got a few of his old choir of Remenham Singers together and gave a programme of musical items entitled "500 Years of Christian Music in Song."

The Rector (the Rev S C Rees-Jones) welcoming the congregation, said the theme of the service was "God is a spirit and we must worship him in spirit and truth." He opened the service with a prayer, this being followed by a hymn, "Lord, Thy word abideth " (15th century melody), and Mr Rogers conducted his small choir in the anthem "Lord, for thy tender mercy's sake " (Composed 1521). Although unaccompanied, it was well sustained and beautifully sung, with harmonies clearly defined.

The chorale, " Jesu, joy of man's desiring," by J S Bach, was notable for the beautiful accompaniment played by Mr Rogers, this being greatly enhanced by the mellow tones of the organ, choir and organ blending well together. Mozart's anthem, "Glorious is thy name," was a great effort, and the choir sustained their parts well, assisted by the organ, bly played by Mr E W Allwright, deputy organist.

"Come, Holy Ghost "(Attwood) followed, Mrs Ham being the soloist and giving a lovely rendering of the first verse, the choir singing the next two verses - a harmonious treat. Mendelssohn's trio, "Lift thine eyes," was rendered unaccompanied by three ladies, a careful balance being preserved throughout. The quartet, "God is a spirit" (Sterndale Bennet), was a splendid illustration of the theme of the service and was sung with great feeling and reverence.

The anthem "Brother James' Air," arranged by Gordon Jacob, has a wonderful tune, and the choir excelled in giving full effect to this in a splendid harmony which breathed a spirit of peace overall. Sir Walford Davies' wonderful anthem, "Lord, it belongs not to my care," sung with great attention, brought the service to a climax. Well sustained in all its parts, it was a joy to listen to. The prayer "God be in my head," composed by Mr A C Neville, was nicely sung, and the service was brought to a close with all joining in the singing the hymn " For all the saints" (tune, Vaughan Williams), conducted by Mr Rogers, with Mr Allwright at the organ. This was a fine finish to a beautiful musical service, for which all concerned were heartily thanked by the Rector.

The lessons were read by laymen and a choir-boy, Master Fassnidge, and the collection, on behalf of the Henley and District Prisoners of War Fund, was well supported. This service, quietly and reverently given, seemed to create an atmosphere of peace, hope and worship, and some felt conscious of the beauty and solemnity of it and came away refreshed for the battle of life after a brief hour of rest.
