FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Remenham friends,

For this edition of the Remenham Newsletter I'm going to depart from my usual custom of writing something related to the Church's calendar, and instead I'd like to tell you about what I did last week.

One of the many charity roles that comes with being the Rector of Henley and Remenham is that of Chaplain to the Henley Sea Cadets. For me this has mostly been about helping on the Unit Management Committee, but over time I've become more interested in the cadets and more impressed by what they do. One of my daughters is now a cadet, and I am keen to get more involved. So last week I drove down to HMS Raleigh, a Royal Navy shore establishment, for a training course for Sea Cadet Chaplains.

I've never been on any sort of military base before, and it was an interesting experience. We were accommodated in the wardroom alongside naval officers, and we had the privilege of mingling with them and sharing conversations about our respective vocations: at a gathering of priests and sailors, stories and drinks will both tend to flow freely... I got to meet other Sea Cadet Chaplains, some of whom were themselves veterans of the Royal Navy, and others who were in the Cadets as children.

Many of you will know that the Henley Sea Cadets Unit is in fact on the Remenham side of the river. And some of you will have seen recently in the Henley Standard that there has been a change in the leadership on the management side, with Phil Fletcher standing down as chair after many years of service, and Andrew Stacey, recently retired from the Royal Navy, taking the helm. We are seeking to renew our engagement with the local community, and there are many ways to get involved. I'm always happy to chat to anyone who is interested in finding out more about the Cadets.

And for those of you who are the praying kind, please do remember that although we do not feel ourselves to be at war, our sailors are putting themselves in harms way at this time off the coast of Yemen to protect international shipping. Let's be grateful for all the brave men and women who are willing to defend this nation and all that it stands for in these challenging and uncertain times.

NOTES FROM REMENHAM PARISH COUNCIL



February 2024

The world does seem to be spinning faster these days. Not only is our newsletter ready to go yet again, the RPC update also has to be submitted. All somewhat reminiscent of school / university project deadlines. I wasn't very good at those either!

But here we are moving out of what must have been one of the wettest Februarys on record. Despite the rain on saturated ground and the resultant flooding

again our poor gardens are being tricked into thinking Spring has arrived and the lawns already need a trim to stay in shape (Before you write...I do recognise not everyone is as obsessive about short grass as I am)

What I would like everyone to be obsessive about is in helping the Parish Council meet its objective of delivering the optimal environment for our Parishioners.

This month I can confirm that two of our councillors who have between them delivered close to 40 years' service have confirmed that the time for them to elegantly step down has arrived. Coincidentally but independently, John Merkel and Darrel Poulos have confirmed their resignations from the council. On behalf of their fellow councillors and hopefully our parishioners I would like to mark their departures with a massive vote of thanks for their excellent contributions over the years and tireless service. They have each been model councillors who remain respected and will be sorely missed.

Thankfully they were each kind enough to forewarn us of their intentions as mentioned in the last newsletter so we are already in the happy position of having two declared candidates for the current vacancies. We have formally advertised the two positions on the website and Parish noticeboard and please take this note as the final invitation to consider whether as a parishioner you would like to add your name to the current list. It is not too late to be considered and the notices will give advice on how to apply. (See also page 8, Editor)

Your council can only be effective with the support of volunteer councillors alongside an engaged parishioner base.

We really do encourage attendance at Parish meetings from any and all parishioners. Coming along as a guest is a great way to contribute and help us stay on track.

A good example is that shown by David Cook who has raised the question of how we may improve the impact and environment on the approach to Henley Bridge. Following David's suggestions, the March meeting will discuss how we can make our side of the bridge a smarter, more welcoming scene for those arriving at the bridge. Do come along to input to the discussion.

Linda Ashwell has also raised an initiative to improve verge planting on the A4130 between the bus stop and Aston lane. Another enhancement for the parish.

We are still on the case to deliver improvements to the slipway at Ferry Lane . With the support of the Council, the Remenham Farm Association, ably led by Ron Emerson and Neil Brown are constructively engaging with the Wokingham Licencing committee to consider a cumulative Impact Policy designed to contain the escalation of major events in our already busy Parish.

We have declared support for the subtle lighting proposed for Henley Bridge by the 'Make Henley Shine' group.

We are talking to SSE about disconnecting our three old street lights as the cost has risen - but looking at replacement independent solar powered dusk-to-dawn street lights.

Add in a project to better record traffic movements and air quality within the Parish (data can be found for February on the website under Traffic Census) and there is a lot going on at the moment.

So in summary, your Council continues to work hard to ensure Remanham remains a very special place for residents and visitors alike. Please keep supporting us...we do appreciate engagement.

Fingers crossed for more clement weather, and enjoy the Spring.




