FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Remenham friends,

One of the joys of this Christmas has been seeing so many people in church; my sense is that this Christmas has been the best Christmas in terms of overall church attendance since before the Covid pandemic, and many clergy colleagues are reporting the same. Perhaps it was because everyone read Camilla Cavendish's article in the Financial Times earlier in December, titled "The restorative power of ritual should not be underestimated"! If you didn't see it, this article outlined the many benefits (this side of eternity!) of religious practice, backed up with a journalistic survey of some of the scientific evidence for the links between religious practice and wellbeing. I read and enjoyed the article, albeit with somewhat mixed feelings. I have no doubt that religious practice often does people a lot of good, and the reasons seem to me to be quite obvious: it supports social life (perhaps especially in old age); it gives both comfort and challenge, and cultivates a sense of humility; it provides a framework for thinking about life and how to live it; it gives shape and structure to our lives. And yet all these things, good as they may be, are not the real reason why I go to church: I go to church because I believe.

Over the next four Sunday afternoons I will be running a discussion group titled "What's the point of being a Christian?" in the Chantry House over at St Mary's (but very much open to Remenham parishioners), despite my feeling that this is, in a way, the wrong question! The real point of being a Christian is, for me at least, that I believe the Christian faith to be true; nevertheless it is useful to think about some of the ways in which Christian belief and practice can be helpful to us in everyday life, and more broadly to chew over some of the big questions about life and how to live it. We meet at 2.30pm on Sunday 14th January, and on the three subsequent Sundays. Everyone is welcome to attend.

With warm good wishes to you all for the coming year!

FED UP WITH PEOPLE USING REMENHAM AS A RAT RUN?

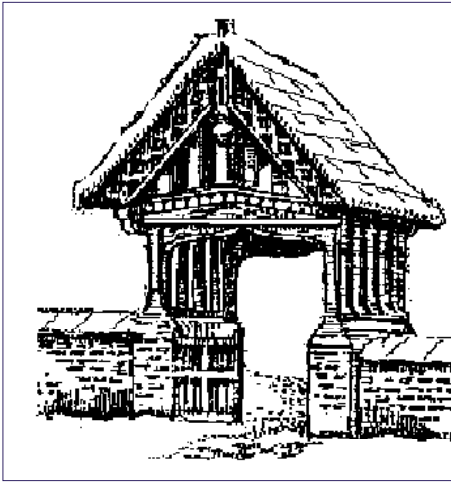
So, if you think you live in Remenham or Aston.....

A Happy New Year.

Can it really be 2024 already? I suspect it is and yet another happy year hopefully lies ahead for our Parishioners. Gardens are resting, worms are busy, TV is marginally better (do watch the post office scandal series on ITVX) and the cold weather is coming after the New Year inundations and flood issues!

As we reflect on what lies ahead a quick look back reminds us that we continue to enjoy living in a wonderful place together. It's not perfect but it is rather good!

In December's meeting we were delighted to have an impressive attendance at the Council meeting. Free drinks and nibbles are always an attraction in Remenham but so too was the opportunity for Parishioners to show their thanks and respect to John Halsall who has decided to hang up his council boots after a mere 30 years or so of sterling service to the Parish. He has been an unpaid volunteer and Chair for many years . It was heartwarming to see so many attend to thank John and wish him well in his well earned retirement from the Parish Council.

We had placed a Councillor vacancy notice on the Board at the Parish Hall and I am delighted to confirm that Paul Binney who lives on Remenham Hill offered himself for co-option and was asked to join the council in that capacity.

We do have visibility of at least two other vacancies arising shortly so I would strongly encourage any other Parishioners who would like to put themselves forward as candidates to do so by contacting either myself (07850 357653) or Paul Sermon our trusty Parish Clerk. Details are on the website. It's a great opportunity to give something back to the community you enjoy living in and with.

In our recent meetings we have continued to focus on issues to benefit residents and visitors. These include....

The perilous state of the slipway in Ferry Lane Aston where it is becoming difficult or dangerous to negotiate a boat trailer into the water.

Numerous issues we would like to bring to the attention of Wokingham Highways Office for remedial, or in some cases urgent attention. I would remind everyone that it is possible to personally raise issues directly via the WBC website but the Parish Council will also continue to push for resolutions here on your behalf.

In conjunction with the Remenham Farm Association we have been guided by a barrister with expertise on licensing matters who has helped the Council to submit comments and suggestions to the Wokingham licensing department which has a consultation window as they consider a new Licensing policy for the Borough. We have requested an additional focus on the Cumulative impact of multiple events on our small and special Parish. Thanks to Neil Brown and John Halsall for leading this project.

My best wishes to all readers for a healthy, happy and prosperous 2024.

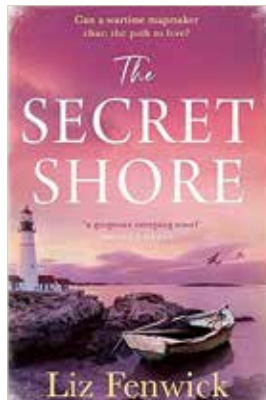


After the business of the day and over coffee, members 'played' with colours, sequins, ribbons and Christmas

SUPPORTING ST NICHOLAS, REMENHAM

Many of you will have received a letter or seen the various notices regarding the Parish Giving Scheme which we have decided to adopt for Remenham. It helps us manage regular gifts



and it also ensures that we can maximise gift aid. Our costs are considerable: it costs us money to pay the bills that keep our church open, to maintain the churchyards and the Parish Hall and to support the work that we do.

Joining the PGS will help us reduce our administration costs and manage the move away from cash-based giving – something which is becoming increasingly difficult with the closure of the banks in Henley.

The PGS was originally developed by the Diocese of Gloucester to provide a professional, effective donation management system to support parishes in funding their mission and ministry. The PGS is a charitable company now owned and funded by the Church of England. All donations made go directly to St Nicholas. There are no hidden costs.



The PGS receives payments by direct debit; the PGS cannot accept any other method. This is subject to all the usual DD guarantees, and you can stop at any time, alter the amount or the frequency of your gift, and also choose to have your gift increased annually to protect against the erosion of inflation.

OUR PARISH WEBSITE - www.remenhamparish.org.uk



Like many parishes, we, in Remenham have our own website. Over the last seven years, our audience has grown from around 10,000, to over 20.000 unique visitors per annum.

But it's time to 'up the ante', by reminding you of the wealth of local information on offer. You'll soon discover that our website can be your 'go-to' **source of local information**.

Maybe, like a very good friend and neighbour of mine, you've rarely visited **www.remenhamparish.org.uk**. Or, if you have, you've never ventured beyond the Home page (with its Parish Council and Church meeting dates and times). If so, then I really do recommend that you dig a little deeper.

For example, if you scroll down the left-hand menu, you'll find '**Rubbish & Recycling**'. This shows the dates of your next rubbish collection (useful to know during Bank Holiday periods).



But you'll also learn about WBC plans for the future, including the supply of solid, wheeled bins in place of plastic bags, as well as a reduced collection service.

There are '**Police Alerts**' on crime in the area – including local trends in crime. Sometimes, the police are asking for witnesses to come forward.

There's a section on '**Traffic and Travel**', which could save you time and frustration, by alerting you to planned roadworks.



All three of these WBC notices are updated weekly, so they are pretty current.



Each summer, the '**What's On**' page has links to the most famous of the local events, as well as useful information about events that are specific to Remenham – such as our Summer Fayre, in early September.

If you've an event looming, such as a party, or wedding, then look no further than the **'Parish Hall'** section of the website. For years, it's been the venue for WI meetings and our monthly Parish Council meetings. But it's also a marvellous venue for parties and celebrations. And it's hosted many wonderful performances by our local thespians.

All this and more...Our website gives you access to your most interesting source of current news: **the Remenham newsletter**. You can also find out about the latest planning applications, or the minutes of the latest 'Parish Council' meeting – and there's a **'History'** section, with articles and observations by local historians.



So, next time you log on, to explore the dates and times of the Church services, or the Parish Council meetings (which we hope you will sometimes attend), do, please, linger a little longer, to find out more about life in Remenham.
