Class 3	3 home-grown fruits or vegetables either all the same or a mix. Please include a note with details of the gardener's experience eg novice grower or child's gardening or experienced gardener	If 3 the same, as close as possible to the same size; if different, flawless, freshness and regularity of size and shape
<b>B Floral Displays</b>		
Class 4	An arrangement from the hedgerow	Quality, presentation, variety of colour, shape and textures
Class 5	A single rose in a vase	Quality, presentation and ideally, please provide a note of the variety
Class 6	Floral display in any container of any style (unconventional welcome)	Quality, presentation, variety of colour, shape and textures
Class 7	Tallest Sunflower (bring it with you or bring a photo with you beside it)	Height
<b>C Baking and Cooking</b>		
Class 8 Children	5 Jam Tarts (Children's class)	Taste and skill in decorating. All 5 must be as close as possible in size
Class 9	2 egg Victoria sponge with jam, no cream	Taste and appearance
Class 10	A jar of homemade preserves eg. Pickles, Jam, Marmalade, Curd	Presentation, homemade cover top, label and container, appearance, taste and texture

Class 11	Mr Potato Head	Creativity, range used as facial features in the creation
Class 12 Children	Drawing or painting of a person or animal (Children's class)	Let your imagination go wild
Class 13	A Photo, painting or drawing of Remenham showing its natural beauty	How well the entry captures Remenham
